

Co-Offensive Players of the Week
Justyn Hardwick/Dewayne Gordon, RB, Syracuse
The duo from Syracuse combined for 272
yards rushing and five touchdowns, each going over 110 yards on the ground. Gordon, the
league's top touchdown scorer, broke into the
end zone three times while Hardwick rushed
for 157 yards on twelve carries. It was Hardwick's second straight game eclipsing the 100
yard rushing mark. Gordon is averaging 2.33
touchdowns per game.

Defensive Player of the Week Harry Roscoe, LB, Plattsburgh
Normally Plattsburgh's starting running back, Roscoe played the linebacker position beautifully for the North Stars racking up eleven tackles against the Red & Black. In addition to being everywhere on the field, Roscoe also forced a fumble and had enough gas to capoff a ten minute scoring drive with a one yard off a ten minute scoring drive with a one yard touchdown run.

Special Teams Player of the Week Zach Grulich, K, Syracuse
Grulich went 7-for-7 against Amsterdam last week, giving head coach Ken Anderson a weapon at the kicker position. The bare foot right legger is 23-for-24 on the year and has made 17 straight PAT attempts. Grulich right leg has been a steady weapon for the Shock as they have yet needed to go for two following their many touchdowns.

GLENS FALLS 21, MONTREAL 14 - An efficient game from Greenjackets quarterback Ian Godfrey and a stingy defense allowed Glens Falls to slip past Montreal. The Voyageurs surprised the Greenjackets by retuning the opening kickoff 92 yards for the touchdown. Returner Wesley Joseph received the ball inside his own ten, turned the corner down the right side and was loose for the score. Deejay Jones evened the game at seven for the Greenjackets with 4:50 left in the first quarter as he trotted from five yards out to capoff a lenghty drive. Glens Falls took the lead early in the second quarter when Godfrey found receiver John Brennan for a 25 yard touchdown giving the Greenjackets a 14-7 lead. Going into the half down 16-7, Montreal put more pressure on the Greenjackets as a drive led to a Matheu Rene touchdown pass to Ryan Perry, cutting the score to 16-14. A Bryan Bagstad 26 yard field goal gave Glens Falls a 19-14 lead with 14:25 to play. In the late minutes a Montreal drive stalled at the Greenjacket 22 thanks to penalities and a strong Glens Falls defense. A Montreal mishandled snap on a punt led to the final two points and a 21-14 Glens Falls victory.

SYRACUSE 49, AMSTERDAM 0 - The Syracuse Shock used a dominant running game to overpower the Amsterdam Zephyrs for their second straight shut out victory. Running backs Justyn Hardwick and Dewayne Gordon each rushed for over 100 yards and combined for five touchdowns. As a unit the Shock rushed for over 300 yards, controlling much of the game. Syracuse jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and tacked on two more touchdowns before the half. The Shock defense recovered three fumbles, as the Zephyrs played without leading rusher Elijah White. Amsterdam also lost starting quarterback Datwan Hemmingway during the game, which along with the Shock defense, slowed down the Zephyr offense significantly. Syracuse quarterback Cedric Stevens returned under center throwing two touchdown passes, connecting with receiver Tyler Gage on both occasions. Hardwick finished the game with 157 yards on 12 carries, scoring twice on the ground. Gordon, the league's top scorer and do-it-all back, compiled 115 yards on ten carries with three rushing touchdowns. The Shock defense racked up eight sacks on the evening, denying the Amsterdam offense any hope of advancing the ball through the air.

PLATTSBURGH 20, WATERTOWN 6 - In a rematch of the 2010 EFL title game Plattsburgh was once again victorious using a stout defense to stop Watertown. The North Star defense forced a total of four turnovers, causing three fumbles and picking off Red & Black quarterback Brian Williams once. The offense started to click just before the half behind quarterback Ken Stay. Following a Watertown fumble, recovered by Kevin Gibson, the Stars drove 60 yards scoring on a ten yard pitch and catch from Stay to tight end Trevor St. Clair. Plattsburgh pushed their lead to two scores as Stay struck again, finding receiver Jordon Keleher for the 22 yard touchdown reception. A Red & Black one yard touchdown run by Grant White following a pass interference call, cut the score to 13-6 late in the third quarter. The North Stars running game found it's rhythm in the fourth quarter as Plattsburgh responded with a ten minute scoring drive to finish off Watertown. Harry Roscoe capped off the drive with a touchdown run. Roscoe also led the North Stars on defense racking up 11 tackles on the night. Watertown running back Anthony Noel led all rushers with 45 yards on the ground. Stay went 8-for-12 with 123 yards and two touchdowns and no interceptions.
